Who We Are

The Klamath Basin Snowdrifters (KBSD) is a non-profit snowmobile club that was founded in 1967. Our current club membership is 88 family memberships. The club is mostly active from October through May and holds general meetings on the second Tuesday of the month from September through April.

KBSD is a service organization responsible for maintaining over 300 miles of snowmobile trails around the Lake of the Woods/Fish Lake/Hyatt Lake area. The club operates a 2014 Pisten Bully snow cat out of Lake of the Woods and an additional snow cat at Hyatt Lake. The club provides firewood to the three warming shelters located at Brown Mountain, Fourmile Lake, and Big Meadow. We also do trail maintenance in coordination with the US Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management as well as many private land owners in the area. Volunteer groomer operators keep the trails smooth to allow for a safe and pleasurable wintertime recreational experience.

KBSD is a social organization with club rides at least monthly. We start the year off in December with a Chili feed/club ride at the Cat Shed and schedule rides in different areas once a month, depending on snow depth. A highlight of the year is the Annual Steak Feed/club ride, usually held at the Medicine Lake/Four Corners snow park. Nothing beats an awesome steak and a hot beverage when you are on the snow! The year end Banquet includes a silent auction and door prizes. 100% of the proceeds from the silent auction is donated to Klamath Hospice, our charity of choice.

Safety and fun are the top priorities of the Snowdrifters. With a wide range of rider skill levels, our club rides always cater to those least experienced. That insures new riders can enjoy their time on the snow. We schedule at least one Snowmobile Safety Class yearly that allows successful attendees to obtain their ODOT Safety Certificate. The Certificate is necessary for any rider that is under 16 years of age and does not have a drivers license. The Club works with ODOT, BLM and the USFS to keep current on new regulations so we can educate our members on current laws. We also keep riders current on groomer activities on our facebook page and on the Clubs website at www.kbsnowdrifters.org.

Klamath Basin Snowdrifters is a member of the Oregon State Snowmobile Association (OSSA.) OSSA provides the funding to purchase the Pisten Bully (\$300,000 when new!) and provides funds for diesel, repairs, and maintenance. OSSA is also our voice to State and National government and works to ensure our snowmobile trails and the rights to use them are not taken away.
